## The Mural

Section I: Depicted is a portion of the American culture of gun violence, the culture which mythologizes the historic use of guns and promotes the freedom to own and use guns. Images include individuals claiming a fear derived necessity, the Constitution's 2nd Amendment at the heart of the gun debates, and the "straw purchaser" who buys guns legally for those who cannot. Guns flow along I-95, referred to as the "iron pipeline," from states with lax gun laws to New York City.



Section 3:
Despite the pervasiveness of gun violence,
the pipeline begins to
be dismantled as parents and siblings and
mentors plant seeds of
change through loving
attention and education.











PIECE OUT, PEACE IN is a collaborative gun violence prevention mural of the American Friends Service Committee, Groundswell Community Mural Project, and the Office of Assembly Member Karim Camara. The collaboration extended to community-based organizations, gun violence prevention activists, clergy, police officers, and community members.

and supportive communities. Youth are entrusted with the power
to dismantle the pipeline
and develop a nonviolent
and productive reality.
